Levens Community Project

There is current interest from a potential purchaser of Sizergh Fell Quarry, whilst interest has also been expressed in a couple of the plots at Cotes. Agents are following-up on these contacts and continuing to market on behalf of the Parish Council. In the meantime, we are working closely with South Lakeland District Council on funding opportunities. The Government has provided SLDC with £2.36m of funding in 2017 (known as the Community Housing Fund) to help tackle housing needs in local communities and enable the delivery of new community-led housing schemes. The Levens Project appears to satisfy relevant criteria and we are developing a significant bid into the Fund.

Affordable Homes to Buy on the Story Housing Development, Levens

Cllr. Helen Burrow is acting as Village Co-Ordinator between prospective purchasers, Story Homes and SLDC for the affordable houses on the new Story development off Greengate (to be known as 'Meadow Wood') and has written the following update:

There will be 17 affordable homes, of which 9 will be for "discounted sale" with the price set by SLDC according to house and bedroom capacity. (Current prices, which are reviewed annually, are: £100,947 for a 2-bed house or bungalow, £116,886 for 3-bed home).

Story's recently approached SLDC to get the "discounted sales" changed to "shared equity" which would have meant a mortgage for a percentage of the house and paying a rent on the remainder. I brought a great deal of pressure to bear on SLDC to justify this proposal and to make public both responsibility for any decision and the criteria applied. The Planning Department, the Chair of Planning Committee and Housing Strategy Dept. and our Councillor Annie Rawlinson, were all contacted to this end.

Luckily, my intervention happened before a final decision by SLDC had been taken. Within a week of the news, I was emailed with confirmation from the Housing Strategy Manager that the homes would REMAIN as "discounted sales" and NOT "shared equity".

In early October, I was notified by Story Homes that the first 4 x 3 bed houses would be ready for allocation around February 2018. The homes are now advertised on the Story website and on Rightmove. They will be advertised for 6 weeks with a closing date set by Story. At the end of the 6 week period, SLDC will assess all applications on financial aspects, savings, mortgage availability, local qualification and housing need. They produce a list of eligible applicants and supply that to Story Homes. Full details of how to apply are on the SLDC website: www.southlakeland.gov.uk.

Story Homes are responsible for property allocation NOT SLDC, but we are in discussion with Story Homes to ensure that due weight is given to applicants from Levens. I have acted as Village Co-Ordinator between prospective purchasers, Story Homes and SLDC for over a year now and will continue my support for Parishioners. Access Improvements at Sizergh Castle

We have been contacted by Sam Sharples, the local National Trust Ranger, with early thoughts about access improvements on the Sizergh Castle Estate. No physical works have been planned yet, but Sam is engaging in some public consultation on ideas about improvements. The Trust wishes to improve accessibility for wheelchair users and prams as well as investing in new maps and way-markers for designated routes. Sam suggests that Brigsteer Wood and around the visitor hub at Sizergh are places in the biggest need of an update. He wishes to take into account how the local community uses the land and whether there are thoughts on where improved wheelchair/pushchair access would be a benefit. We have raised the ongoing problems of dog fouling and will be asking for more specific signage on this (and particularly fouling in open country with the risks to grazing stock as mentioned in the last Newsletter). We will invite Sam to a Parish Council meeting to talk about proposals in more detail so if any Parishioner wishes to comment, please email the Clerk with thoughts.

Woodland and Roadside Verge Management

A meeting with the local Forestry Commission Officer is planned for late October when the extent of Parish and Charity woodland in the village will be reviewed. The scope for the development of a management and the availability of grants will be considered. We have drawn up plans for the tidying of the old W.I. land on Brigsteer Road, recently donated by them to Levens Charity and work on this will begin during the winter. This will include the planting of a tree donated by the local W.I to commemorate their centenary. Discussions with other Parishes who have concluded arrangements with Cumbria County Council for the management of roadside verges have begun and it is hoped to have a scheme in place for the Spring of 2018.

B4RN (Broadband for the Rural North – high speed internet connection for the village)

Ducting has been installed from Hincaster to the A6 opposite Levens Hall; the main crossings under the A6, the River Kent, the A590 and the route into the location for the main cabinet have all been identified and work is being planned. Total investment in B4RN made by Parish residents is £82,000. Further investment will be required to make the project viable – Many residents are looking at taking £1500 shares to gain free connection.

The main core route round the village has been identified and agreement obtained from landowners. However, it would be possible to improve this route with further landowner agreement and this is still on-going.

The village is split into blocks of around 30 houses in order to plan a chamber (Manholes) that will enable it to connect to the village ring main and route through land and gardens – some blocks still do not have organisers / champions. News of the start of further construction is expected very soon.
